# Holidays and Festivals

- Lunar New Year (Seollal 설날) January
  Koreans show respect to their elders and ancestors and give gifts to one another. Almost everyone wears their Hanbok on this day.

  Special Food: Sliced rice cake in soup (tteokguk 떡국), and honey cakes (yakgwa 약과).
- Farming Festival (Hansik 한식) 105 days after winter solstice
  One of the biggest four traditional festivals. Start of the farming season.
  Special Food: Mugwort cake (ssuktteok 쑥떡), mugwort dumplings
  (ssukdanja 쑥단자) and mugwort soup (ssuktang 쑥탕).
- Spring Festival (Dano 단오) June
  Festival to celebrate spring. People have wrestling matches (ssireum 씨름),
  and give each other fans so they can beat the heat in the coming summer.
  Special Food: rice cakes (tteok 떡).
- Children's Day (Eorininal 어린이날) May 5
  A day to honor children and think of those whose lives are very hard.
- Midautumn Festival (Chuseok 추석) September or October Some people call it Korean Thanksgiving. Special Food: stuffed rice cakes (songpyeon 송편), and taro soup (torantang 토란탕).
- Christmas (Gidoktansinil 기독탄신일) December 25 Special Food: Christmas cake!

### Other Food

- Bee Bim Bop (비빔밥) Rice with egg, meat, and many vegetables mixed in.
- Kimchi (김치) Pickled vegetables eaten with most meals.
- Milguksu (밀국수) Long noodles for special occasions, bring good luck.
- Bulgogi (불고기) Grilled strips of meat with sauce.

   very important to them.
- Independence Day June 12
   Like Independence Day in America, people wave Philippine flags everywhere, have big parades, and shoot off fireworks.
- Eid al-Fitr End of Ramadan

  Even though only a small part of the Filipino people are Muslim, everyone has the day off to celebrate the end of Ramadan.
- All Souls Day (Araw ng mga Patay) November 2
  Filipino people have picnics by the graves of their ancestors to remember them and honor them.
- Christmas December 25

A lot like Christmas in America. People in the Philippines celebrate Christmas for more days than anyone else in the world. IN the Philippines, people make beautiful paper lanterns for Christmas.



- Soccer and field hockey are popular too.


